QUESTIONS TO ASK THE DEBTOR AT §341 MEETING OF CREDITORS
BY DEBTOR’S COUNSEL FOR CASES ASSIGNED TO
TRUSTEE, KRISPEN S. CARROLL

1. State your appearance for the record.
2. Let the record reflect that I have personally viewed Government issued photographic identification and proof of social security number for the debtor.
3. Verify the Chapter 13 Trustee Status Sheet info (Please forward a copy of same to your client in advance of the hearing)
 - Is your name spelled correctly on the Trustee’s Status Sheet?
 - Is your address and last four digits of your social security number accurate on the Trustee’s Status Sheet?
 - What is the year of your birth?
 - What is your marital status?
 - How often are you paid? (weekly, biweekly, semi-monthly, monthly)? Did you sign the petition, schedules, statements, the Plan and related documents?
4. Did you review and personally sign the bankruptcy petition, schedules, statements, and Chapter 13 Plan?
5. Have you made a full and complete disclosure of all your assets and everything you own?
6. Have you listed all of your liabilities and everyone you owe money to?
7. Have you previously filed bankruptcy?
8. Have you filed your tax returns for the last four (4) calendar years preceding the commencement of this case?
9. Have you lived in the State of Michigan continuously for the past two (2) years?
10. Are there any errors or omissions to bring to the Trustee’s attention at this time?
11. Do you have a Domestic Support Obligation (DSO)?
 - NOTE: The case cannot be confirmed without proof to be provided at confirmation that this obligation is current.
12. Do you have any pending lawsuits or potential causes of actions?
13. Do you have any interest in any pending probate estate or are otherwise expecting to receive funds from an inheritance?
14. Have you watched the debtor orientation video on the Trustee’s website?
15. Please proceed with any other questions relevant to this case.
